Dwight moved to this area from the Midwest, desperate to escape the violence he had faced in his hometown for years. Unable to find a place to live or to secure a job, **he ended up homeless.**

Fortunately, **Dwight found CFH**—and great hope for a better future. He was immediately welcomed by CFH staff, and he quickly settled in thanks to the structure of the shelter. Dwight also happily made friends with everyone, from the other residents to the volunteers.

Ready to build a new life for himself, **Dwight began working with a case manager, who connected him to much-needed resources.** With this support, Dwight was able to obtain health insurance and see a doctor for help with his disability. And, he started to look for part-time work.

Soon, he was ready to move into a transitional housing program.

**But, Dwight's story doesn't end there.**

Dwight had always dreamed of having his own place one day, so his case manager helped him to sign up for the Seattle Housing Authorities Section 8 lottery.

One year later, Dwight's dream came true! **He soon moved into his own one-bedroom apartment, where he currently lives—and thrives.**

## CFH's New Year-Round Shelter Opens

In September 2019, we opened our year-round shelter. This was a monumental undertaking involving generous donors, the City of Bellevue and the business community. In a short amount of time we were able to retrofit our building with a sprinkler system enabling us to operate from May - October, giving hope and stability to men experiencing homelessness.

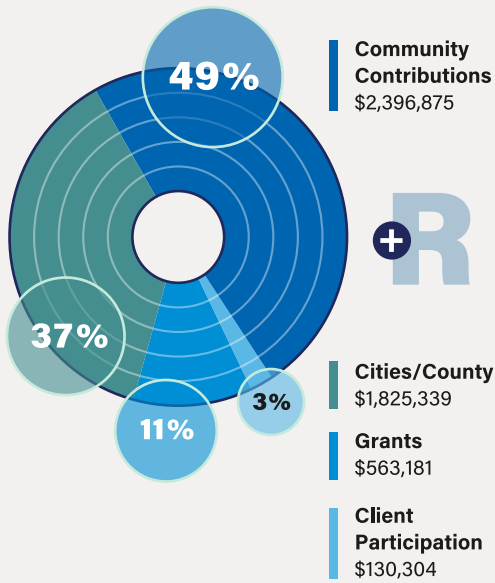
We are sincerely grateful for the outpouring of generosity from all donors in 2019. Your gifts have made an enormous impact on CFH fulfilling its mission.

**Your support helped us to offer year-round emergency shelter — for the first time ever!**

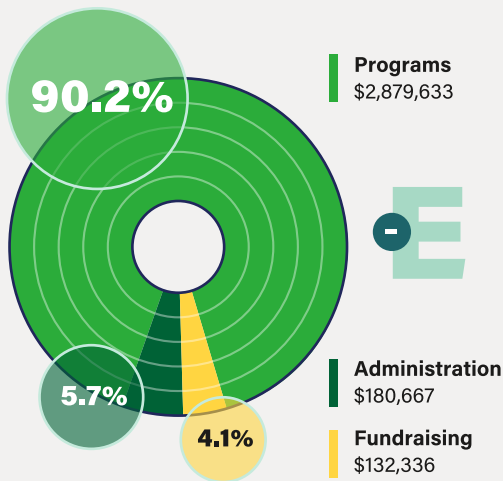


## 2019 FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

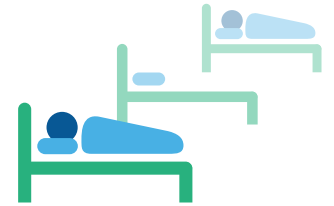
